Annual Program Planning Conference

Here is how a pack program planning conference works. A month or two before the scheduled face-to face conference, the committee chair and Cubmaster gather the following information:

1. Key school dates
2. Community event dates
3. Your chartered organization's dates
4. Personal dates that may affect your pack's activities
5. District and council dates
6. Collected Family Talent Survey sheets from all parents
7. Last year's pack annual plan if you have one

Annual Program Planning Conference

To maximize the efficiency of your planning, the following people should attend the conference:

1. All Pack Committee Members
2. All den leaders
3. All pack/den aids and den chiefs (optional)
3. Chartered organization representative
4. Unit commissioner (optional)
5. Parents and Anyone else you think might be helpful
