We ask a lot from our unit leaders — recruitment, advancement, monitor BeAScout pins, plan program, recharter, monitor member-


ship renewal and training status. It's time to thank them!

### Safety Moment -**Aquatics Safety**



Since the inception of Scouting, learning to swim and engaging in aquatics activities have been core to the program. More than 1.5 million aquaticsrelated merit badges have been earned since 2009.

Take Scouts near any body of waterwhether it's a pool, lake, river, or ocean—and they have a natural desire to go swimming. There are plenty of ageappropriate aquatics activities.

But before that swim or row, we want everyone to have a plan and be on the same page when it comes to aquatics safety in the Scouting America program. The two key training prerequisites are Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat.

Both courses can be found on my.Scouting.org and taken online anytime. All leaders are encouraged to take the training and at least one adult needs the training when unit aquatics activities are conducted. Upon course completion, leaders should be able to understand the key points of each program.

- Qualified supervision, personal health review, safe area, response personnel, lookout, ability groups, buddy system, and discipline make up the eight points of the Scouting America's Safe Swim Defense.
- Qualified supervision, personal health review, swimming ability, life jackets, buddy system, skill proficiency, planning, equipment, and discipline make up the nine points of the Scouting America's Safety Afloat.
