

- Training
 - My.Scouting- Online resource for Cub Scout and Scout BSA training
 - Leader specific training (Cub Master, Den Leader, Scout Master etc.), Youth Protection Training, Hazardous Weather Training and so on.
 - Just wanted everyone to be aware so that they can take the training they need and help their unit leaders and volunteers find the resources as well
- District Recognition

- Journey to Excellence (JTE)
