This year for our Cub Scout Spring Event on May 17th, 2025, we are doing things little differently. We are holding and



Council Wide fishing derby for all of our active Cub Scouts and asking them to invite their friends who were not Cub Scouts with the hope of recruiting them to the pack. We hope for a Wildly successful multiple location event. This event can be held practically anywhere where there is a waterfront. The Council has a loaner program for fishing gear if you need Rods, Bait, Bobbers and Hooks. May 17th is a free fishing day for Nebraska, so you won't need a fishing license or park permit. However all local fishing regulations and park regulations apply. The Derby will have Council prizes, for the Biggest fish, Smallest fish, and Ugliest fish. BABYSITTING WITH 1ST AID AND CPR, MAY 23

Come try the new and updated Babysitting program from the American Red Cross designed for ages 11-16. Learn business basics like resumes, interviews, and advertising. Engage in group discussions around leadership, responsibility and decision making techniques. Develop your knowledge and skills for working with young children and infants, including care skills. Learn about milestones, and developmentally appropriate behaviors and behavior management. Gain a 2-year certification in First Aid and CPR upon successful



scenario completion. We encourage anyone interested in working with young children, or becoming a Counselor In Training (CIT), or younger camp staff to try out this training.

Please bring: a lunch, a water bottle, something to write on, and something to write with.

Snacks will be provided.

After the class, access to an eBook and an app with the skills and information in the class will be given.

If a participant is interested in purchasing a hard copy of the Babysitting book, they are available on site the day of training for \$20.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID, MAY 31ST

Mental Health First Aid is an international evidence-based education program proven to be effective in teaching adults how to recognize and respond to signs and symptoms of mental health and substance use challenges. Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA) is designed to teach par ents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or substance use challenge or is in crisis.







Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who regularly interact with young people. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including ADHD), and eating disorders.

Kristi Lange is a licensed clinical social worker, licensed mental health practitioner, and a provisionally licensed alcohol and drug counselor. She has been working within the mental health field for more than 10 years. She currently serves as a social worker on the LPS Threat Assessment Team. Kristi also serves on the HopeLNK Suicide Prevention Coalition. She has been teaching Youth Mental Health First Aid courses for the last 4 years.

NYLT is designed to have youth staff teach leadership skills to youth participants. From beginning to end, it is a YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM!

NYLT is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops, crews, ships, and in other situations demanding leadership of self and of others.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what he must KNOW, and what he must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.



NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

NYLT integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skill and confidence to lead well. REGISTRAR'S UPDATES

Hello Unit Leaders,


It is almost that time of year for Unit and Member Renewals. (Previously referred to as Recharters). Remember that these are now two different processes, one for Unit Renewals, and one for Member Renewals. It's not too early to start thinking about any unit position changes. These can be changed in Organization Manager/ Position Manager in your My. Scouting account by the Chartered Organization Rep OR the Chartered Organization Rep Delegate (assigned by the COR) The other option is to have the volunteer fill out a new adult application, forward to the office, and we can make these changes. Please have your volunteers do their Youth Protection Training as they come due to avoid any problems with your Unit Renewals. You have 60 days, (June 2nd is when you can start) before the July 31st deadline to renew your unit. Attached you will find the Annual Unit Charter Agreement and the current fees. Helpful steps for Unit Renewal, Units Renewing their Members, Parents Renewing their Youth Memberships, and Adults Renewing their own Memberships to the Key 3 of the Unit can be found in the link below. The Annual Unit Charter Agreement NEEDS TO BE SIGNED AND SUBMITTED TO THE OFFICE. (You can submit this at any time starting today!) If you need help with your Renewals please reach out to set up an appointment. Appointments can be held over the phone or in person, but we ask that you please call ahead to set this up. 
